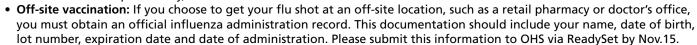

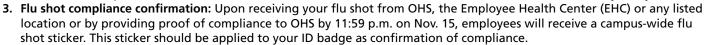
Get your flu shot this week

The influenza vaccine (flu shot) is mandatory for all employees and volunteers, with limited approved exemptions*. To support the health, well-being and safety of our patients, guests and staff, please receive your flu shot no later than Saturday, Nov. 15.

Steps to receive your flu shot

- Complete the 2025 Influenza Vaccination Survey in ReadySet: Log
 in to your ReadySet account <u>here</u>. Alternatively, you can access your
 account through Parkland Pathways using this <u>link</u> and no password is
 required.
- 2. Flu vaccination compliance requirements: To remain compliant, you must either receive the flu vaccine or provide documentation of your current flu shot by 11:59 p.m. on Nov. 15. Employees can receive the flu shot at no cost from the following locations:
 - Occupational Health Services (3rd Floor, WISH)
 - Employee Health Center (4th Floor, Moody Outpatient Center): Walk-ins are welcome at the EHC from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday (with a lunch break from noon to 1 p.m.).
 - Flu Drives in the Private Dining Room: 3 to 7 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 13, and 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Friday, Nov. 14





Exemption request process for religious, medical or reasonable accommodation

- Please note that the exemption request process consists of two steps and must be completed by Nov. 15.
- Previous exemptions do not carry over from year to year, unless specified.
- After submitting your survey to request an exemption, you will receive an email containing the exemption form. This form must be completed and returned by Nov.15.
- If you have previously received an indefinite exemption, you are still required to complete the survey.

*Employees who do not receive the flu shot by the Nov. 15 deadline (or those granted exemptions/reasonable accommodations and who do not comply with the mask requirement) will be subject to corrective action in accordance with <u>OTM Procedure 8000-100 Health Screening/ Immunizations</u>.
